## **John Stark at International Conference in California**

Twelve John Stark students attended the DECA International Career Development Conference in April in Anaheim, CA. DECA is a not-for-profit student organization with more than 215,000 members in all 50 United States, DC, Canada, China, Germany, Guam, Mexico, Puerto Rico and Spain.

Students earned the chance to compete at the conference during February's DECA State conference. The following students competed in: Warren Quinlan, Food Marketing; Owen Payeur and Jackson Flanders, Financial Services Team Decision Making; Greg Labrie, Business Finance; Alycia and Alex Silva, Marketing Management Team Decision Making; Chris Mann and George Lord, Business Law and Ethics Team Decision Making. Noah Payeur, Quianna Willard, and Cailee Green participated in the Thrive Academy at the Conference, where they networked with other students to expand leadership skills. Alesha Kimball participated in the Elevate Academy, where she learned skills to become the ultimate DECA chapter leader.

JSRHS students participated with 20,000 other students from around the world.

## **John Stark Collective Bargaining Revote**

There will be a deliberative session on Tuesday, May 23 at 7pm, at John Stark Regional High School to discuss a single article: Shall the John Stark School District vote to approve the cost items included in the collective bargaining agreement reached between the John Stark School Board and the John Stark Teachers' Association? This is a reconsideration of Article 04 of this year's school warrant which failed in March. Article 05 allowed for a special meeting to reconsider Article 04 if it failed, and that article passed. Following the Deliberative Session, the resulting article will be voted on June 20 in a special election.

The John Stark School District Board will meet at 6:30pm on May 23, then recess to the Deliberative Session.

The Supervisors of the Checklist will meet May 13 and June 10, from 11-11:10am at the Town Clerk's Office to register people to vote. Residents can also register at the Town Clerk's Office, but May 13 is the deadline to register for the Deliberative Session. June 10th is the last day to register at the Town Clerk's office for the special election, but residents will be able to register at the polls on June 20th.

Absentee ballots will be available at the Town Clerk's Office after the Deliberative Session. There are also request forms online at [weare.nh.gov](http://weare.nh.gov) under Town Clerk -- Elections.

The vote on June 20th will be at the Weare Middle School, from 7am to 7pm.

## Firearm Use in Weare

The Weare Police Department receives many calls from residents about their neighbors using firearms. It is unclear to many what the laws and town ordinances entail. Below are some of the questions we are frequently asked:

Q: Is there a noise ordinance in the Town of Weare that regulates when residents can shoot and for how long?

A: No.

Q: I have concerns about my neighbor shooting close to my property. Are they legally allowed to do this?

A: If they are safely shooting at least 300' away from a permanently occupied dwelling, with a proper backdrop, they are allowed to shoot. Reference NH RSA 207:3-a and NH RSA 644:13.

Q: Am I required to have a permit to carry a concealed firearm in NH?

A: No. As of February 2017, the concealed carry permit is optional, instead of mandatory.

## Process & Business of Science

John Stark Regional High School science students traveled to the Seaport World Trade Center for The Essential Protein & Antibody Engineering Summit on May 4. While at the convention, the students had a number of tasks to complete in each of the

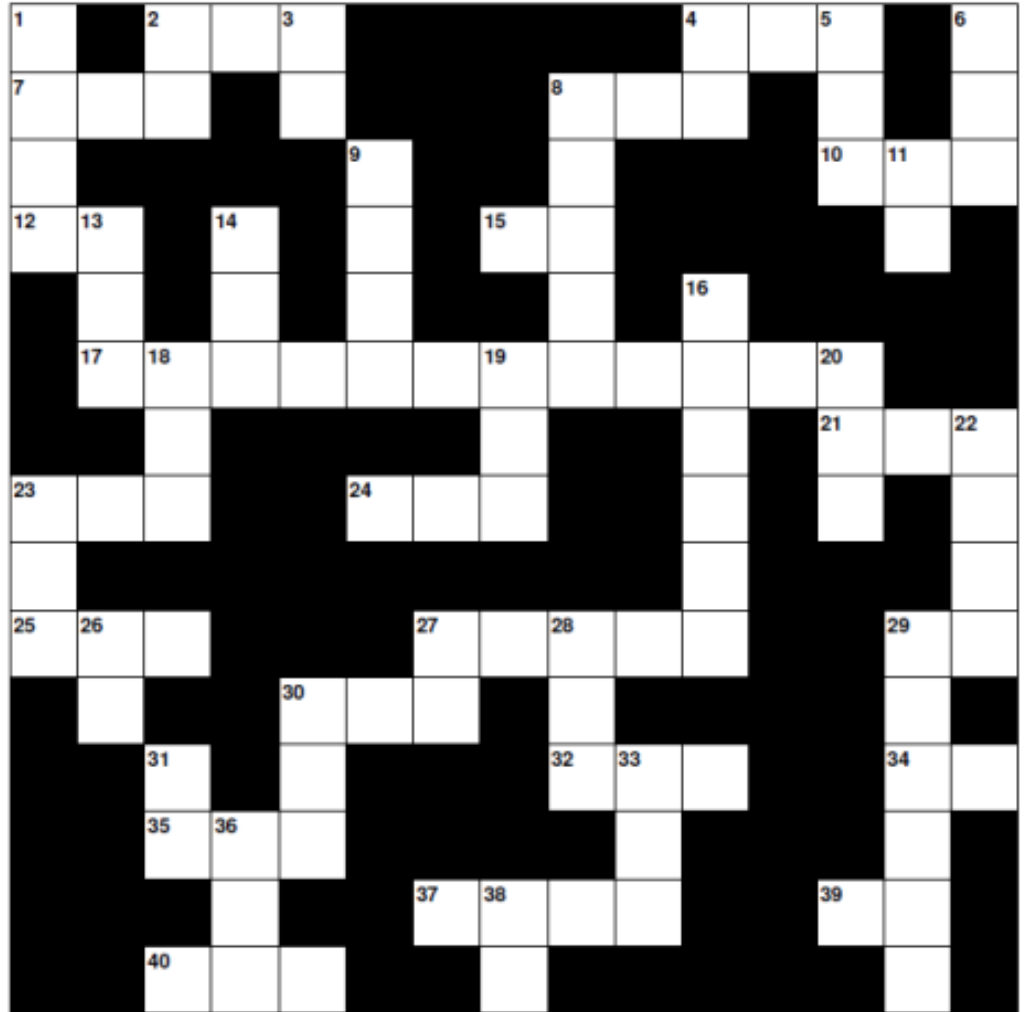
