Free Passes to the Millyard Museum

The Weare Public Library now has free passes to the Millyard Museum, part of the Manchester Historic Association, located at 129 Amherst Street in Manchester. Passes admit up to 4 people. The library can only issue one pass for a given day, so please contact the library at 529-2044 to reserve the pass when you know which day you would like to use it. Families may want to pair the Millyard Museum and See Science Center Pass for a fun day in Manchester. The See Science Center offers two floors of hands-on science fun at 200 Bedford Street in Manchester. Please reserve this pass ahead of time as well.

The library also has discount passes to the New England Aquarium in Boston, but only until the end of June. Grab this last chance to get up to four people into the aquarium for just a \$10 per person co-pay. These are very limited, so reserve now!

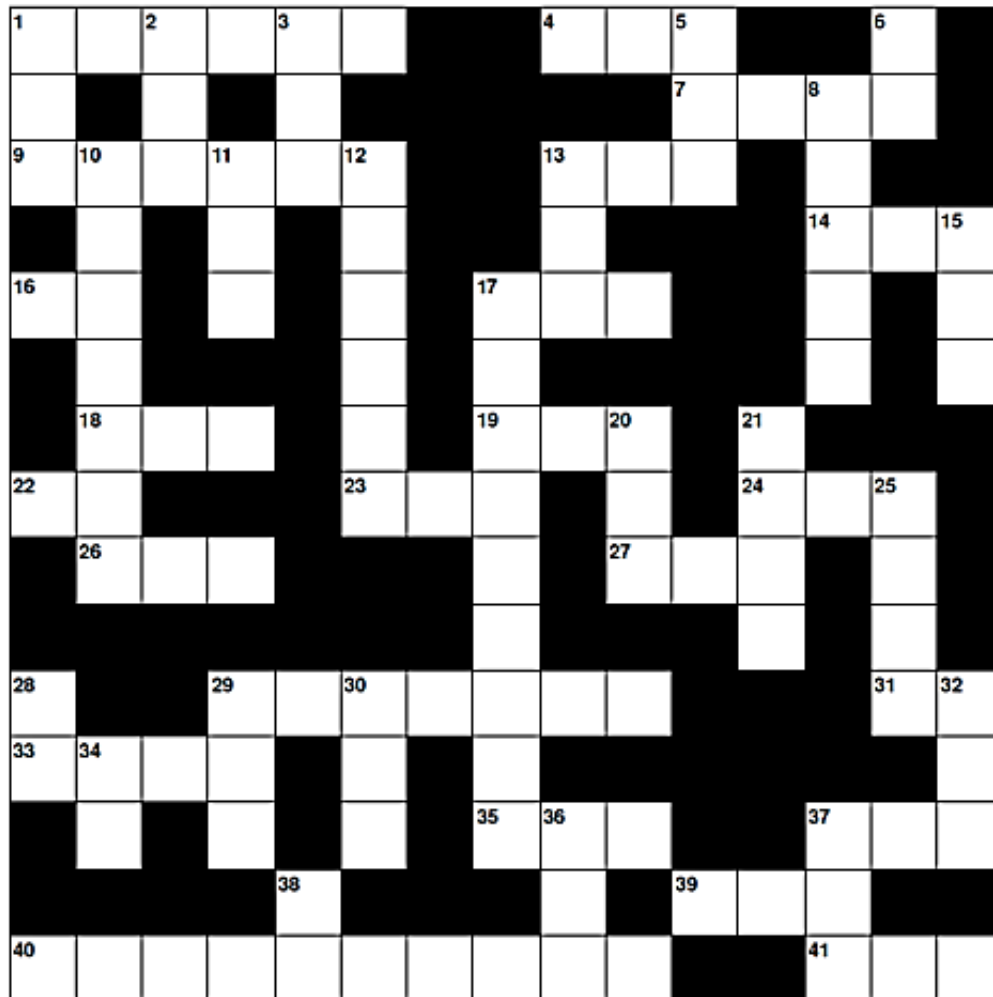

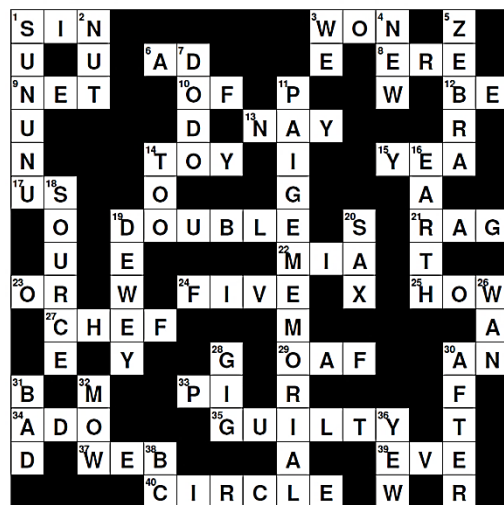
