## John Stark Forensics Class

John Stark Regional High School students in Heather Brady's Forensics I class recently completed project-based final exams where they created the story and scenario behind a crime and built to scale 3-D models of the crime scene. In addition to using the forensic science tools of evidence like blood, fingerprints, postmortem changes, and forensic entomology (insects) to create the crime story and model, the students also utilized a great deal of additional technology.

"Many of the pieces in each model were made on our 3-D printer," said JSRHS teacher Heather Brady. Students learned to 3-D scan body parts, chairs, and other items using iSense 3D scanners attached to iPads to create the bodies in their scenes. They would then fix up the file and convert it to a format that can be understood by the 3-D printer. "The task was to pull together the knowledge they acquired throughout the semester regarding different types of evidence (blood, fingerprints, post mortem changes) and create a crime scenario that was supported by the evidence presented in their model and story. Learning to use a 3-D scanner and 3-D printer was added to expose students to new technology," continued Ms. Brady. The iPads, iSense scanners, and 3-D printer were all purchased with grant money that Ms. Brady was able to secure earlier this year.

"The students had to apply the Forensics they learned this year to be able to create these stories and models," said Mrs. Brady. "It was fun to see how engaged the students were when creating the model and story. The conversations that occur about evidence as they work collaboratively are a better measure of their depth of understanding than a paper and pencil test I think," continued Ms. Brady.

The idea for having the John Stark Forensics students create crime scene

models was inspired by the work of Francis Gessner Lee. It was Lee's Nutshell Studies of Unexplained Deaths, 20 miniature crime scenes she meticulously created for teaching the emerging days of evidence gathering, that made forensic investigation into a science. Lee died in 1962, but the models are permanently installed in the office of the Chief Medical Examiner in Maryland and used for training purposes.

"I read an article entitled, "Welcome to the Dollhouse of Death," in Popular Science that was about Lee's work when I first started teaching the course," said Ms. Brady. "I cannot bring students to real crime scenes for teaching, but we can replicate the scenes here in the classroom and learn from them that way."

## Caution When Passing Bikes

Weare Police Department recently received a concerning complaint from a bicyclist after an individual failed to respect the NH law on passing bicycles. Fortunately, in this instance there were no injuries sustained. Motorists are encouraged to familiarize themselves with this important law and share its existence with others so that we may promote safety!

Passing: New Hampshire requires that in the event a motor vehicle passes a bicycle it shall leave a safe distance, not less than 3 feet, when passing the bicycle at 30 mph or less. The motor vehicle must pass with an additional foot of clearance for every 10 mph over 30 mph. For example, a motor vehicle travelling at 50 mph, would have to leave at least 5 feet of space when passing a bicycle.




