Middle School Enrichment Opportunities

Enrichment students at Weare Middle School have done some research on Extended Learning Opportunities (ELOs). These offerings are typically available only to students at the high school level, but some WMS students are brainstorming ways to make such a program happen in middle school. Pictured above, Alexis Rinker and Brooke Blackburn work on their ELO, learning sign language.

Weare Middle School has been exploring a variety of new devices in the STEAM area (science, technology, engineering, art, and math). Recently, Snap Circuits, Breakout EDU boxes and Sphero EDU were brought into Weare Middle School enrichment groups for the students to try some additional exploration. Using Breakout EDU boxes, students worked in teams to problem solve and unlock the codes to several locks and then opening the boxes to find the "treasure." The Snap Circuits offer students the challenge of creating various circuits.

Sphero EDU, which was loaned to WMS teachers as part of collaboration with John Stark Regional High School teachers, promotes curiosity and critical thinking. WMS students programmed the Sphero robot to trace outlined shapes taped on the floor. Students in this activity had to show an understanding of angles, direction, speed, and velocity to program Sphero successfully.

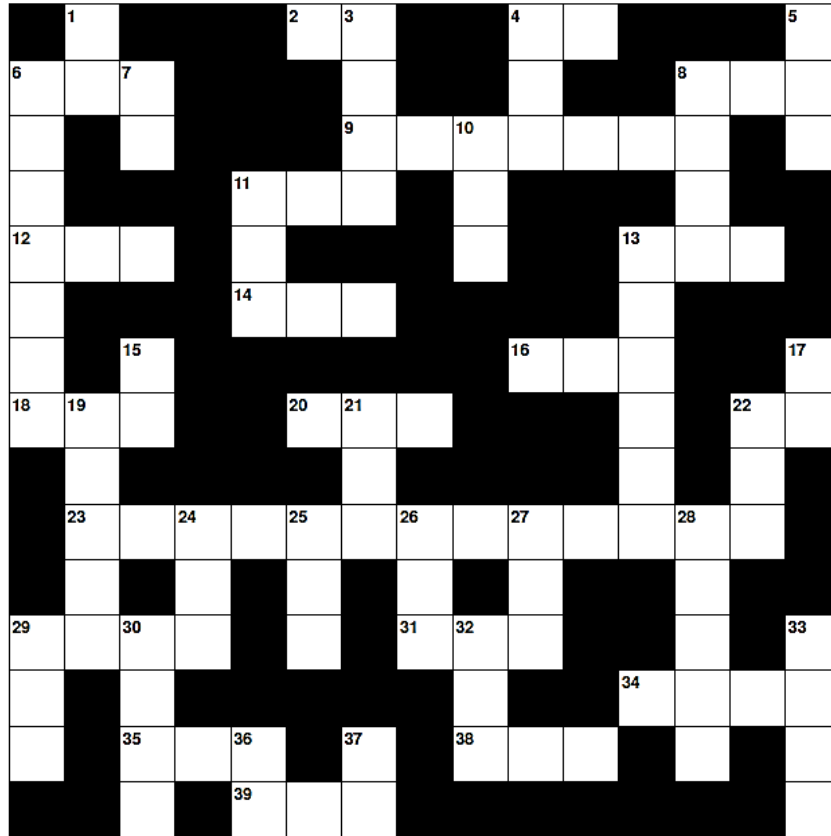

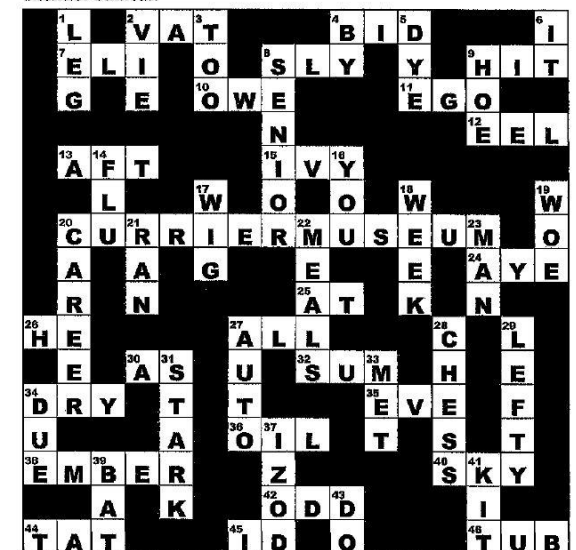
