Town & School Election Results

Incumbent Fred Hippler and newcomer Sherry Burdick won seats on the Board of Selectmen. The Town Budget failed. Two percent raises for non-union employees were approved as were \$15,000 to repair Town Buildings and \$49,660 to repair the bell tower at the Town Hall. \$44,571 to purchase a police cruiser passed, but funding for a new police officer did not. The town approved all the Public Works articles: \$185,000 for a plow truck, \$95,320 for a back-hoe, \$480,000 for road reconstruction and resurfacing with up to \$278,320 coming from the State Highway Block Grant, \$105,000 for Bridge Reconstruction, and a part time truck driver.

The town shot down a proposal to spend \$60,000 for 2 pavilions at Bolton Park, but were generally in an approving mood. Voters approved two articles for spending Cemetery Trust Funds, \$6,500 for fireworks for the Patriotic Celebration, spending \$10,000 from the Buxton Bequest for fitness equipment for the Fire Department, and both requests for the Conservation Commission to spend money from the Town Forest Account.

In non-money questions, KENO passed, the Finance Committee was directed to broadcast/record its meetings, Selectmen were given authority to dispose of all tax deeded property by public auction or sealed bid, and Selectmen were directed to form a committee to begin the information-gathering process to revise the town's Master Plan. The Fire Department was allowed to change the name and purpose of the Weare Fire Department Replacement Vehicle Special Revenue Fund to allow for the purchase of equipment in addition to vehicles.

Incumbent Donny Guillemette and newcomer Heidi Colburn won seats on the Weare School Board. Voters rejected the Weare School Budget, as well as a request to retain \$75,000 in surplus funds for the School Building Maintenance Fund.

Scholarships Honor Dr. Eleanor Campbell

Weare's high school seniors and current college freshmen are eligible for scholarship aid through the Eleanor A. Campbell Charitable Foundation. The application period for students planning to attend accredited post-secondary institutions in the fall is open until April 16. Awards are made on the basis of a strong academic record, financial need, personal dedication to the pursuit of excellence, and contributions to the community. Special awards are made to students considering journalism, the ministry or health related fields of study. In 2017, eight awards were made to Weare students. Students in Hillsborough and Deering received eighteen awards.

Dr. Eleanor Campbell was a prominent physician in New York City who summered in Deering, where she founded a clinic that served women and children of Weare, Hillsborough and Deering. She established The Deering Foundation in 1931 as a means of aiding deserving individuals in the local area to pursue higher education. Now a public charity renamed the Eleanor Campbell Charitable Fund, the work of the Foundation continues to honor Dr. Campbell through summer school and college financial aid, and support of community projects.

Applicants are advised that completion of all details on the application is important. Weare Garden Club Scholarship

Weare residents of any age are eligible to apply for the Weare Garden Club 2018 scholarship. Each year, the Garden Club sponsors a scholarship for a student enrolled at an accredited institution. Applicants must be attending, or planning to attend, an accredited college, Master Gardener program, or other post secondary program for the study of plant sciences such as botany, horticulture, forestry, plant science, environmental science, agriculture, landscape design or other closely related programs. This award is based on character and commitment to the field of endeavor, and is not need-based.

The application deadline is April 15 for a June award. Applications are available at John Stark Regional High School or by emailing wearegardenclub@gmail.com. Should there be no qualified applicants at that time, the deadline will be extended for consideration of summer school students. Cheryl Elliott is Scholarship Committee Chairman. Committee members are Jill Drake, Ronda Gregg and Anne Wirkkala.

Scholarships are funded by proceeds from an annual plant sale, to be held on May 19. The Weare Garden Club welcomes gardeners of all skill levels. Meetings are the first Tuesday of the month at 7 p.m. in the Sawyer room of the library from March through November.

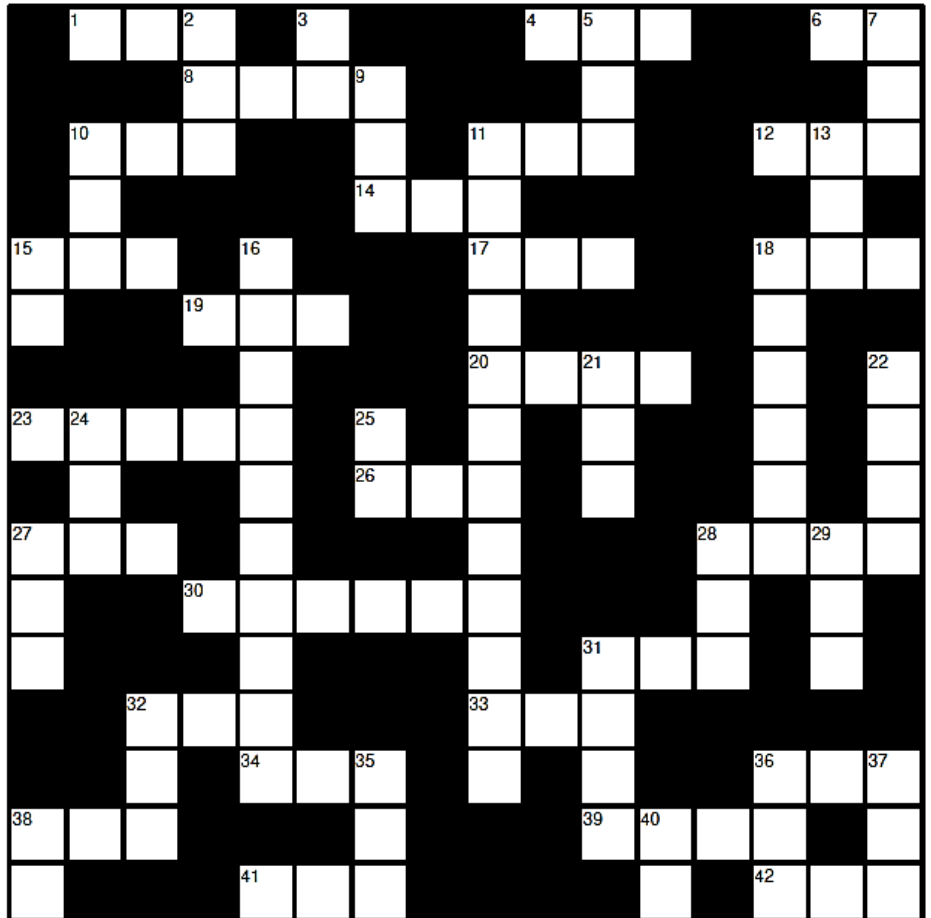
