Comment on Solid Waste Proposal

The deadline is June 13 to submit a comment on the Permit Application for a Solid Waste Collection/Storage/Transfer Facility by Granite State Recycling at 33 B&B Lane in Weare. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, Waste Management Division has received a Standard Permit Application from Granite State Recycling, LLC., who seeks to operate a collection/storage/transfer facility for single stream recyclables, municipal solid waste, and construction and demolition debris.

The proposed facility would receive a maximum of 300 tons per day of all waste types, which would be processed through an existing building on the premises. No additional construction or permanent site alterations are proposed. The permit application is available for public review during regular business hours at the Town of Weare Land Use Office, 15 Flanders Memorial Road, Weare, and at the NHDES' office at 29 Hazen Drive, Concord.

Testimony may be submitted in writing to NHDES at any time before June 13 at 4pm. This testimony must be submitted to NH Department of Environmental Services, Waste Management Division, Solid Waste Management Bureau, 29 Hazen Drive, P.O. Box 95, Concord, NH 03302-0095, or by email at swpublic.comment@des.nh.gov to be officially included as public record.

Weare FD Donation

The Weare Fire Rescue Department recently donated used equipment to the Dominican Republic. The outdated breathing apparatus was replaced through the 2017 budget process. After finding it difficult to dispose of the equipment in the U.S. market due to its age, the Department began working with the Organización Dominica De Recursos Internacionales, Inc. (ODRI). ODRI, a 501C 3 non-profit organization, coordinates the collection and transportation of donated equipment to various fire departments in the Dominican Republic. In all, twenty-six breathing apparatus units and associated equipment were donated.

Orlando Vargas, President of ODRI, thanked both the Boards of Selectmen and Fire Wards for their generosity and kindness in helping the Dominican Republic Fire Service and communities they serve.

Next Generation Welders

Intro to Welding was offered for the first time this year at John Stark Regional High School. Three sessions of the one semester class were taught by Tech Ed teacher Joab Owen.

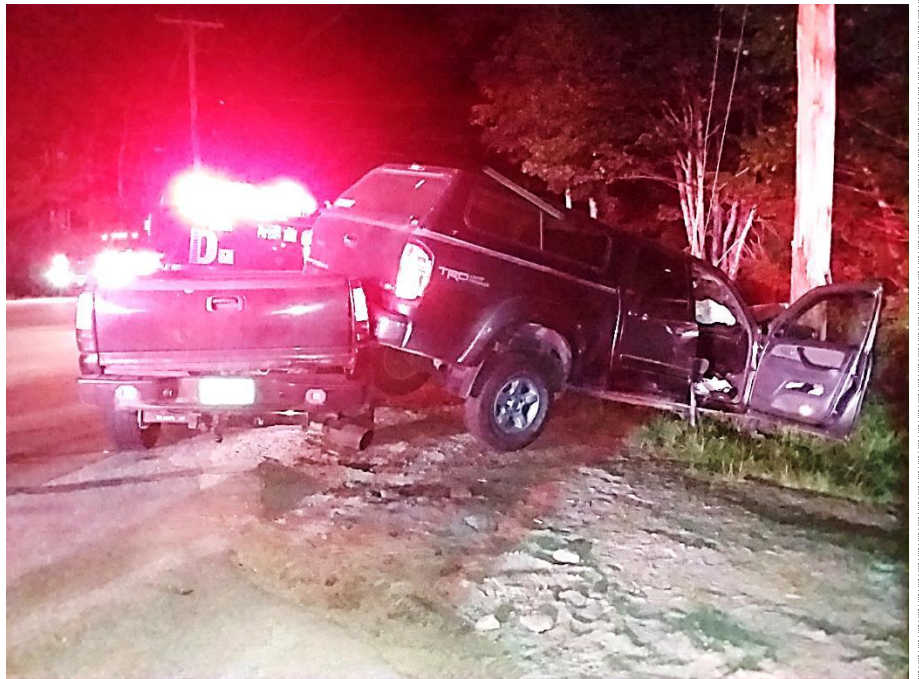
"The idea was to offer students an opportunity to move into a career path that has excellent job prospects," said JSRHS Tech Ed teacher Joab Owen about the Intro to Welding class that was offered for the first time this year at John Stark. "This class helps students assess their interest level in welding and from there they can decide to continue in a welding program after high school or simply have a new skill for their personal use."

To help develop the course and to be sure what he teaches is what the industry desires, Mr. Owen consults with an informal group of people in the welding field. Participants in the informal group include Dan Chabot, chair of the welding department at Manchester Community College and who was also instrumental in getting welders and equipment donated to John Stark for the program, Mark Stock owner of Multi-Weld in Contoocook and Garrett Soucy from Matheson Gas. The welding program at John Stark also received community support with several donating metal for the classes.

Welding skills taught in this one semester Intro to Welding class included oxy-fuel cutting and welding, stick and MIG welding. Three sessions of Intro to Welding were held in this inaugural year. Future plans will include Tig in an advanced welding class and perhaps adult classes.

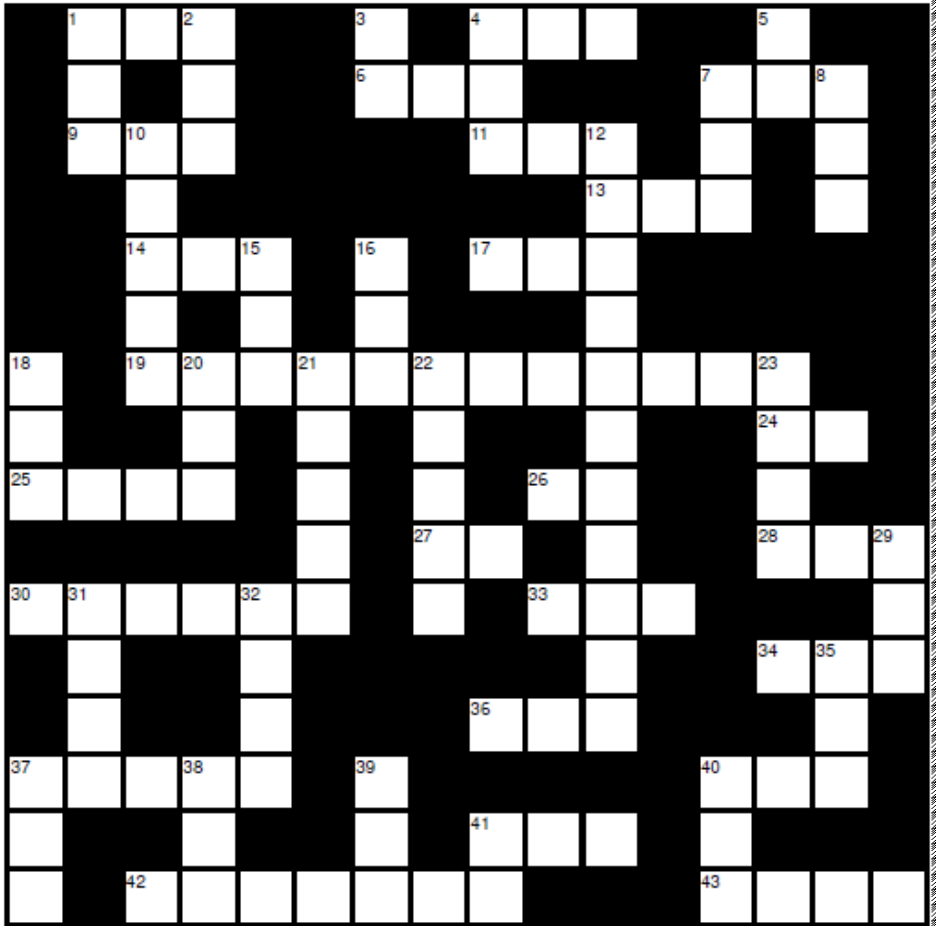
