## Weare Fire and Rescue Honored for Their Work

Nick Keane, 21, of Hillsborough survived a horrifying accident in March, partly due to the exceptional work of the Weare Fire and Rescue Association. Mr. Keane was present last week when the Hilton Garden Inn Manchester honored the members of the Weare Fire and Rescue for their service by donating \$3,000 to the volunteer association during the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce's monthly Spotlight on Business. Twenty-five bags of non-perishable foods and personal items, which were used as centerpieces during the event, were also donated to the Weare Food Bank.

Keane was trapped in an industrial lathe with his upper body crushed. The chances of survival were faint. Weare Fire and Rescue Association stabilized the badly injured man and coordinated the arrival of the Dartmouth-Hitchcock Advanced Response Team to airlift him to Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center in Lebanon.

After spending nearly a month in the hospital, including 10 days in the intensive care unit, and having five surgeries performed on him, Keane eventually returned home and is continuing his road to recovery.

This is the third year HGI management has selected an organization to support during the annual chamber event they host. Keane joined his mother Mandy Keane, the front desk manager at HGI Manchester, for the presentation.

"It's amazing what they did to keep him alive," Mandy Keane says.

"When we started this two years ago, we wanted to make sure we were helping organizations that were making a difference," says Sharon Nista, Director of Sales for HGI. "These brave men and women are truly making a difference."

## Rt. 114 Crash, Aug. 8

As of Monday, August 13, the Weare Police Department reported that the motor vehicle accident August 8 on Route 114 near the Weare Middle School remained under investigation, and that no additional information would be released at the time.

WMUR reported that a vehicle struck two utility poles, as well as a portion of the fencing in front of the school. The accident closed Rt. 114 around East Road. The NH Department of Transportation tweeted the road closure at 3:34pm, and that the crash cleared at 1:15am. Granite State Telephone issued a service alert on August 8 stating that there was a service outage affecting parts of Weare, Hillsborough, and Washington due to the crash. Service was restored to all customers at 8:20pm the next day.

## Middle and Upper Elementary to Share Schedule

Weare Middle and Center Woods Upper Elementary Schools will share the same start and end times this year with a 7:30am start and 2:05pm end time each day in both schools.

"This change to a shared time will allow for a better learning environment for both schools. When we were on different schedules, the building would be noisy for those in class while others were coming to school or leaving for the day. It also lends for greater collaboration for staff across the whole building," said the Interim Principal of Weare Middle and Center Woods Elementary Schools Shawne Hilliard. "It allows more professional growth opportunities due to the consistent end of day schedule," she continued.

Also new this year in the Middle School is what administrators are calling E-Cubed alternatives. What is E-Cubed? "It stands for Enriching, Engaging, and Extending learning opportunities for our middle school students," said Interim Principal Hilliard. During this time each day, 7th and 8th grade students may take a language (French or Spanish) or select classes with expanded learning experiences from all content areas (science, math, reading, writing, and social studies). Sixth grade students do not take a language, so they will have six offerings to choose from for expanded learning for the school year.

"Last year we held scheduling workshops with community members and staff to see what we needed to add or change about our schedule," said Mrs. Hilliard. "We took those suggestions and were able to create a school day that allowed Weare Middle School to have consistent Flex Block times, E-Cubed opportunities, recess for 6th graders, and in 7th and 8th grade, a 15 minute scheduled outdoor break," she continued.

Deans Phil Matzke and Brett Gottheimer and I are excited for the new school year for all the students in our shared building," concluded Mrs. Hilliard.

Bus routes are available on each school's website. Parents of 4th and 5th grade students should check the Weare Middle School bus schedule for bus stops and times.


